A WORD FROM KORY



Writer Anne Lamott said, "The opposite of faith is not doubt; it's certainty." I find that quote quite provocative, because I often find that those who appear most certain in their faith are also the ones who least allow their faith to be challenged and to grow through difficulties. After all, if you are certain about what you believe, why ask questions and entertain alternative ways of believing? And yet, faith is not a static thing, but a dynamic force that grows and changes and expands as we live our lives. Each new obstacle we face in life is an opportunity for our faith to increase and strengthen...if we allow room for growth.

The circumstances of our culture right now are a great example of this. For so long, we were certain of one thing: on Sunday morning, we would be able to get up, get dressed, and go to church. Sure, a lot of things in life are uncertain, but we couldn't imagine a situation that would prevent us from living out our basic human freedom to worship when and where we want. We took for granted this fundamental feature of our faith. And then COVID happened.

That's one reason why so many of us (including me!) are struggling with not worshipping on Sunday. We had gotten used to our freedoms and our routines, never guessing that either could be disrupted. While we hadn't grown completely complacent, we did mentally invest in a level of security that we thought couldn't be changed. And yet, because of the capriciousness of life, we should have known better. Nothing is certain.

Maybe this challenge to our certainty isn't such a bad thing. Maybe we needed our faith to be shaken a bit in order to understand what it means to put our trust in God, not in buildings. After all, we know in our hearts that the church is not the building and that God isn't confined to those four walls and stained-glass windows. This pandemic has forced us to look for God in other places and redefine what it means to worship God in our world.

We could take a lesson here from the Israelites. For centuries, the focal point of religious worship for the Israelites was the temple. Located in Jerusalem, it was the center of Jewish religious life, where people would travel for hundreds of miles in order to worship and pray. The top of the temple was the Holy of Holies, where God was thought to reside. The temple was God's house, as if God could be contained.

What do you do when the place you worship no longer exists? The Jews had to face this question when the temple was destroyed. They could no longer worship regularly in the place they had worshipped their whole lives. Did they give up their faith? Did they convert to paganism? Did they demand the Romans rebuild and reopen the temple? In the face of uncertainty, they adapted. The temple, which used to be in one place, was suddenly in many places, as Jews worshipped in their homes and in other gatherings. The temple became any place people worshipped God.

Our "temple" is no longer accessible to us for now. It's simply not safe for us to gather for worship on Sunday morning like we used to do. What was certain is now uncertain, and we have to adapt. If you're like me, you're tired of that. You're tired of Zoom and worshipping with a screen. You're tired of the uncertainty. But God didn't call us to be certain; God called us to be faithful, and we can do that in the sanctuary, in our cars, or in our homes. The church is wherever we decide to live out our faith in God through worship and service.

I'm uncertain when all this will end and we'll be back at Crestwood. But I am certain that, until we are, God is present with us. So keep worshipping in all the places we are making available, trusting that, until we can be together again, God is keeping us connected.

Dear Friends,

We are in the middle of the twin pandemics of racial injustice and COVID-19. The brokenness in our country is palpable. We are still unable to gather safely for worship. The challenges are great and the need for the best of us is greater. We are facing days that call for our best selves.

Friends, I know it is easy for us to choose sides and demonize those who are different from us. I realize that we are weary of COVID and it is tempting to live like the virus is not such a threat. But we are better than that. We are followers of Jesus Christ.

Thursday Bible Study is reading 1 Corinthians. It's interesting that a word written so long ago to a church in such a different time could still be relevant. Paul is reminding the church that they are different. They are not to be swayed by the culture or the practices of others. And then comes the passage we have often relegated to weddings. He reminds the church that they are to love and then he defines what that looks like. As we make our way through these days, let's listen to these words. Let's take them to heart. Let us be strengthened by them. Let us live them.

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails."

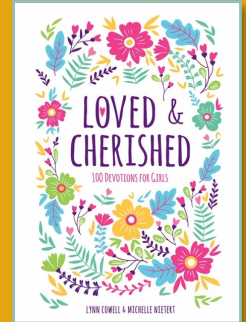

The Niere Family is doing well. Uwimana, the mother, is now employed at Toyota. Desire, the father, has learned to drive and is taking her to work each day. A family in their church, who had a van, picked them up in the early months of their arrival for a ride to church. That family later moved to Ohio and gifted their van to the Niere Family.

The oldest son, Olivier, worked full-time this summer at Gall, Inc as a "runner." Just before school classes started he told Gall that he would have to quit so he could be in virtual classes and study. He suggested that he could come in at 4:00 PM if they wanted him to work part-time. They did. So he works until 11:00 PM. This young man is also making grades at the top of his class. All the other children are also doing well in their studies.

Desire has a skill as a seamstress and worked as such with Handicap International before coming to the United States. He has applied for a job but must become more efficient with the English language before being employed. They are certainly on the road to independence.

Thanks again for all the support that the Crestwood community has provided. You have been a blessing to them.

WAYS TO STAY CONNECTED TO CRESTWOOD

CHURCH LIFE MEMBERSHIP APP



Want to look up Membership Directory entries on your smartphone or tablet? Well, there's an App for that! First, go to the appropriate App Store and download the **ACS Church Life** app. Once you install it and get a password (see below), you can

search for and display directory information right on your device. And the directory information you receive reflects all recent changes! In addition to the basic information, it includes the most recent picture in the church system. You can click on the fields to call the phone number, send an email, or locate the address on a map. At the bottom are links to information about other family members.

When viewing an individual's membership record, note the dark blue icons at the top right; pressing the square one will allow you to add this information to your contacts list. Pressing the one on the far right that looks like a pencil opens a screen where you can request changes to an entry.

To get started, you need a valid email address that is in our church system; if you haven't shared one with us, now is a good time to do that. You can either call the church office or send an email to office@crestwoodchristian.org. Once you have a valid email address in the system, download the Church Life app. Email webmaster@crestwoodchristian.org and you'll get a password by return email. Then, just open the app and sign in using your email address and the password you receive. If you have questions, email the webmaster.

Picky technical note for downloading the app on an iPad: ACS Church Life is, in Apple lingo, an "iPhone Only" app. You'll need to select "iPhone Only" at the top left of the search screen, not iPad Only. You can still access it on the iPad, it's just not a full screen display. And, one more really picky technical note: If instead of getting the normal login screen, you get one which asks for a "Site Number," just swipe the screen to the right and you'll be back on the normal login screen.

Join our Remind account to receive text messages or emails about Crestwood Christian Church weather delays, event cancellations, and other important information. Click or type in the URL www.remind.com.

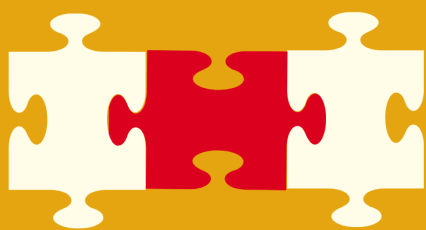

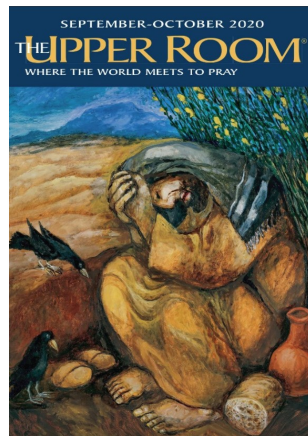
